Over the years, I have reached out to various prominent figures, expressing my appreciation for their work. Admittedly, in the back of my mind, I've hoped they would deign to respond. I have written authors such as Yan Martel, who wrote "Life of Pi," along with Christian poet, author, and lecturer Christian Wiman. I once wrote Don Henley of the Eagles along with New York Times columnist, David Brooks. I will often send our Mayor Paul Young encouraging and supporting emails because governing this dear city of ours can't possibly be easy. About a decade ago, I wrote Pontiff Emeritus (Benedict XVI) a short letter thanking him for something he had written which at the time made a strong impression.

You might be surprised to know that of the personalities I've listed, all of them but Don Henley wrote back. If he only knew that I was the Eagles' biggest fan! I'll never forget opening the letter from Benedict, which he even signed. The Roman Pontiff writing a lowly Lutheran pastor. Miracles happen, folks. The fact that most haven't written me back makes those who did all the more special. Frankly, I think one of the main reasons for their response was that I was sure to use the prefix "Rev." in all my letters.

We feel good, happy, validated when people engage us especially when these

people are a little more prominent than ourselves. A kind word, a thank you note, a phone call, can make a big difference. 'Tis more blessed to give than to receive but it's still very good to be on the receiving end of benevolent words.

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. Indeed it did! God mercifully deigned to come to sinful people in Jesus Christ and among the main reasons for it was to validate us, to make us feel loved and important. Jesus came to the unloved, the disliked, and the unwanted and from God's perspective we all fall into all of these categories because of sin.

Lent soon begins. During Lent we focus on God's benevolence in Jesus. Let's not forget the fact that God's love for us went so far as the cross. I would die for my family, close friends, and you would, too. I doubt I would willingly die for anyone else, but God did exactly this: died for those no one liked, or wanted, let alone loved.

There's a verse in a Lenten hymn that always strikes a chord within me. "Do we pass that cross undeeding, breathing no repentant vow?" (LSB 423) Heavens, no! Remembering, grasping even in the smallest degree, how God deigned to reach out in love to us, may we be drawn to Him and may we always validate others with God's love.

In just four months, our Tanzania Team will be departing. Where has the time gone!? We are still in need of donations to help with the international airline tickets over and back that will be purchased in January. We plan to leave on Thursday, May 14, and return on May 28. The in-country housing, transportation, and food will have to be purchased in February. The next fundraiser, plus future donations and offerings, will be used for that cost.
