He is retired from the US Navy and currently works at St. Jude. Steven has felt called to the "SMP" program. "SMP" stands for "Specific Ministry Pastor." This would be a part-time position. He would be under my and Pastor Matt's supervision. He would never be able to ascend beyond what is outlined in his duties as an SMP pastor. In other words, Steven could not be the Associate Pastor or Senior Pastor. He would always be in the role for which he will be trained. Training would be conducted online through one of our seminaries.

This is a Called position, and the congregation will need to properly agree to call Steven after he has successfully completed two years of course work. By the time you read this, the Board of Elders and the Church Council will have been informed of this as well as our district president, Rev. Dr. Roger Paavola, who is working with us. To answer questions about this position, I held a Q & A meeting on Sunday, Jan 26, and hopefully provided some clarity. I will host another information session on Sunday, Feb. 2, after late service in the sanctuary. Be sure to attend the Voters Meeting on Sunday, Feb. 9, 12:15PM, in the Fellowship Hall, in which we will discuss and vote on next moves for this position and the calling of a DCE.

Having Steven Andrews as a ministry assistant will provide needed stability down the road, especially during pastoral transition. In addition, the position stands to expand and enhance our ministry in a couple of areas.

Thank you for your time and thank you for your important part in making Christ the King the special place that it is. May God bless you and your love ones.
