

P: People of God, in preparation for coming to the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us faithfully examine ourselves and make confession of our sins to our gracious God as part of our preparation.

All: O almighty God, merciful Father, I recognize that I am a sinner in many ways. I therefore confess to You all my sins, both those that are known and those unknown to me as well. I deserve Your present and eternal punishment. But I am sorry for these sins and I do sincerely repent of them. Gracious Lord, for the sake of the sufferings and death of Your Son Jesus Christ, be merciful and gracious to me. Forgive me all my sins and grant me the power of Your Holy Spirit so that I may change my sinful life from this day forward and forever.

P: In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Exodus 12:2-14

² "This month is to be for you the first month, the first month of your year. ³ Tell the whole community of Israel that on the tenth day of this month each man is to take a lamb for his family, one for each household. ⁴ If any household is too small for a whole lamb, they must share one with their nearest neighbor, having taken into account the number of people there are. You are to determine the amount of lamb needed in accordance with what each person will eat. ⁵ The animals you choose must be year-old males without defect, and you may take them from the sheep or the goats. ⁶ Take care of them until the fourteenth day of the month, when all the people of the community of Israel must slaughter them at twilight. ⁷ Then they are to take some of the blood and put it on the sides and tops of the doorframes of the houses where they eat the lambs. ⁸ That same night they are to eat the meat roasted over the fire, along with bitter herbs, and bread made without yeast. ⁹ Do not eat the meat raw or cooked in water, but roast it over the fire—head, legs and inner parts. ¹⁰ Do not leave any of it till morning; if some is left till morning, you must burn it. ¹¹ This is how you are to eat it: with your cloak tucked into your belt, your sandals on your feet and your staff in

your hand. Eat it in haste; it is the LORD's Passover. ¹² "On that same night I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn—both men and animals—and I will bring judgment on all the gods of Egypt. I am the LORD. ¹³ The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt. ¹⁴ "This is a day you are to commemorate; for the generations to come you shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD - a lasting ordinance.

HOLY GOSPEL Luke 22:7-20

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-second chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord. (spoken)

⁷Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. ⁸So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it." ⁹They said to him, "Where will you have us prepare it?" ¹⁰He said to them, "Behold, when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him into the house that he enters ¹¹and tell the master of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?'" ¹²And he will show you a large upper room furnished; prepare it there." ¹³And they went and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover. ¹⁴And when the hour came, he reclined at table, and the apostles with him. ¹⁵And he said to them, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. ¹⁶For I tell you I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." ¹⁷And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he said, "Take this, and divide it among yourselves. ¹⁸For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." ¹⁹And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁰And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

MAUNDY THURSDAY

Good Evening. Thank you for being here for a most holy evening and a most holy event in the life of our Lord Jesus and His disciples, past and present – Maundy Thursday. This is the night the Lord instituted the Lord’s Supper as a last will and testament for His followers. With a love beyond our ability to comprehend, the Lord comes to us in His very body and blood, in with and under the bread and wine to forgive our sins, strengthen our faith, and assurance of our everlasting life with God after this life has ended. We approach the altar in humility, knowing that it is only by the Lord’s grace that we are able to be in His presence and partake of this holy meal. We pray that tonight’s service will be a blessing to you in your faith and walk with God.

In the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod we practice what is called “close” communion. This expression means that all who commune at our altar to receive this great gift of God believe in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in, with and under the bread and wine, and embrace the teachings of the Lutheran faith according to the Scriptures. While we welcome and encourage everyone to participate in this sacred meal, if you are not a member of a Lutheran congregation, we ask that, if possible, you please contact one of the pastors prior to receiving the Sacrament. You are welcome to approach the altar to receive a blessing.
