Congratulations to the Confirmation Class of 2025!

As part of their path to completing Confirmation instruction, the students were asked to write a "Statement of Faith" to include their thoughts on the importance of Confirmation, two concepts that stood out to them, and an expression of gratitude for those who have helped them along the way. The following are excerpts from their essays:

Davis Byrum — "The Doctrine of Real Presence states that the body and blood of Jesus is present in, with, and under the bread and wine...Lutherans believe that we eat the bread and drink the wine along with Jesus' true body and blood through a sacramental union."

Elayna Smith — "Confirmation Class used to just be a class I had to take for my church, but now it means a lot more to me. It is a class that not only helps strengthen my own beliefs, it also prepares me to control the reins of my faith as I grow older and transition from middle school to high school."

Eowyn White — "The Ten Commandments remind me to follow God's Law and that it's important to obey His will....And when I break a Commandment, I know to repent of my sins and ask God for forgiveness."

Luca Calhoun Williams — "Christians understand that our faith in God is what truly makes the Holy Spirit live in our souls to lead us in Christ's path."

Ali Schmidt — "One of the most important things I have learned is that nothing I have done, am doing, or will ever do can change what Jesus did for me...no matter what I ever try, I cannot earn my salvation. Jesus already did that for me."

Audrey Eldridge — "One thing I learned is that we are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone. This reminds me that although I am unable to save myself, there is nothing that I can do to separate me from God's love."
