2026 TANZANIA MISSION

To communicate to the people of Tanzania the life-changing power of Jesus Christ in a practical and understanding way; to develop them into responsible, productive, successful Christians, and to equip them for their ministry in the church and like mission in the world.

With the help of our Mid-South District Mission Coordinator, Bob Allen, a group of Christ the King members are planning to return to Tanzania, Africa, in May of 2026. Our previous missions that started in 2005 focused on outreach ministry. Team members will go door-to-door in villages to spread the Word of God and the wonderful news of Jesus Christ's death and resurrection.

<u>SUNDAY</u>, <u>August 17</u>, after Sunday School, we will hold a "get acquainted" meeting for all those interested in joining the 2026 Tanzania Mission Team. We'll talk about cost, daily activities, and past experiences, and begin general planning for the late spring 2026 Mission trip. We plan to visit the city of Shinyanga, home of the Southeast of Lake Victoria Lutheran District (SELVD). The main emphasis of the mission will be to share the Good News of Jesus with the Sukuma people, located in Northwest Tanzania. The team will be accompanied by local ministers and lay persons who will act as translators. We will be using simple techniques such as an Evangecube of Bible storytelling. So, if you can share a 4th grade level Sunday School lesson in your own words, **you are qualified!**

Again, please join us in the Conference Room (first floor, first room on the right) on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>August 17</u>, at 11:00am. If you are unable to make the meeting, we have information available for you to pick up. We will have the next meeting in September after the 11:00 worship service. We will alternate meeting dates for both worship services.



Under the auspices of Health Talents International, the members of this mission trip served at Clinica Ezell in Monte Llano, Guatemala. This was Emily's 8th trip and George's third. Emily, a second-year medical student at UTenn, worked as a surgical assistant in the general OR while George served as a caregiver in post-op and assisted the nursing staff in the patient ward. In total, seventy-five surgeries were performed in the week they were at Clinica Ezell.

The Brammeiers are touched by the faith of the Guatemalan people, including one woman who, after receiving a miracle at the clinic, told all her village and now they go to the clinic "where God works." As the Brammeiers left, one gentleman named Manuel said to George: "Farewell, God bless you. I tell you, George, to God there are no distances because the love of God unites us." As a result of their many mission visits, George and Emily deeply admire the Guatemalan people who, despite their living conditions, are always joyous and faithful. George shared: "We have learned to appreciate all of our gifts and it has profoundly moved us to continue to give our time, talents, and treasures in the future."

You are encouraged to be open to where the Lord may call you in mission work, whether close to home or far away. Sharing God's love and mercy is our opportunity to act as Jesus would have us live.


