Hello, Christ the King family! If you can believe it, the month of October has already flown by and it would seem that Fall is officially here. I have always loved the Fall season as the weather gets cooler, leaves begin to change colors, and the Christmas season is just around the corner. Soon the year 2025 will be over and 2026 will begin. Crazy how fast the year goes.

As we approach the end of the year, I am sure everyone's calendars are beginning to fill up quickly. After all, this time of year is when school gets busy, end-of-the-year work deadlines need to be met, and family members begin to come in town for Thanksgiving. With all this busyness, it's easy to forget about all the things that have happened this year. Maybe I should say, all of the things God has provided for us this year. We get so wrapped up in our lives that we forget how much God provides us each day, through the whole year. It may take some time, but I encourage you and your family to try this some night. Come together and look at the past year and see what God has done for you. What things are you thankful for? Are there new things happening? Maybe there is something you're thankful for every year that God continues to bless you with. Whatever they may be, I think you may find more than you think at first. I know I certainly did.

That's why I think Psalm 107 fits perfectly with the theme of Thanksgiving. The Psalmist writes that the LORD's "steadfast love endures forever!" and this word steadfast means so much more than we can express. It comes from the Hebrew word root (he-sed) which no one really knows how to translate into English. Not because it's confusing but because it means love beyond what you and I can even understand. It encompasses "loyalty, favor, faithfulness, mercy, goodness, kindness, and unfailing love." Basically, a love only the God of all things could give. A perfect love. None of us could have that kind of love for anything or anyone. Yet it's this love from God that has given us everything we have in this life. Even the smallest thing you own was given to you by God because of His love for you. It's this steadfast love of the LORD that moved Him to send His Son Jesus Christ to pay for our sins. As Saint Paul says in Romans chapter 5, "but God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Our Lord Jesus Christ is the ultimate showing of this perfect love God has for all of us. Because in spite of all our faults, mistakes, and sins, God never stopped loving us and He never will.

This is why the Psalmist cries out in thanksgiving to God. Because he knows this love from God is undeserved and cannot be matched by him or anyone else. Yet God hasn't changed and still shows His love each morning. We, too, can join the Psalmist in his praise of thanksgiving to God each day for the love He has shown us. I encourage you all to take some time in your busy schedules to reflect on and remember all the wonderful things God has done in your life this year. Look at it as a small reminder that even through all the hardships and trials, God's steadfast love has never left you and never will. Many blessings to all of you!


