
EPISTLE Colossians 1:13-20 (By His blood, the Christ who holds all things together also holds us in His kingdom.)

Polina Osetinskaya, 49 years old, is a world-renowned Russian pianist. A child prodigy, she performed publicly for the first time at the age of six. When she was only eleven, she made her debut in the Great Hall of the Moscow Conservatory, where she performed Mozart's sublime 23rd Piano Concerto in A Major.

An elite talent of her level, she and her team have the luxury of choosing when and where she will perform, including the amount of her compensation. Every year, around the Thanksgiving and Christmas season, she performs a charity concert at a hospice facility in Moscow.

When a reporter asked incredulously why she plays concerts for the residents, she responded, "How can you not play concerts at the hospice? I don't really understand." The reporter countered, "There are thousands of pianists in Russia, and yet you go perform." Ms. Osetinskaya shook her head dismissively and said, "It's such a valuable, important feeling, when you are passing, to have it treated as a meaningful act, full of dignity."

How beautiful to know that a woman of her stature considers it a blessed gift to perform for those struggling near the end of life. This Thanksgiving and Christmas season, as we recall how God dignified us with His Son, let's ask ourselves how we might do the same.
