From the time I was a young boy until well into my teenage years, I remember my dear mother arranging an Advent wreath in the middle of our kitchen table. Three purple candles, one pink, with a white candle in the center. We would gather together, usually just before dinner, and Mom would read the brief devotion out of *Portals of Prayer*. Sometimes she would ask my sister or me to read, and I remember feeling a little nervous because I knew that family around the table, lit candles, and devotions meant something important was happening.

Mom's intention was noble but her implementation had a few holes. In the early weeks of Advent there was more faithfulness to the schedule but as the days and weeks passed, there were lapses. Thankfully, I never processed the inconsistencies as anything other than the normal course of events and maybe this was due, in part, to the fact that Advent always meant Wednesday evening worship.

As with many things in life, it's hard to determine the impact those Advent moments around the kitchen table or even the midweek services had on my spiritual formation but I would be wrong to conclude they weren't part of a larger fabric of interwoven events that had no influence. We are all the products of our past, after all.

Too many well-intentioned folks have too many false expectations when it comes to formative faith moments. They want the one big, powerful, glitzy experience; they want the "life-changing" worship experience; they want a miracle, a sign. God certainly works through these, but more often He chooses a slower sequence of things, ones which stretches out over years, through life's ups and downs, to mold us, and part of the reason for this has to do with the nature of faith itself.

Faith is a life. It's not one singular moment. The redeeming work of Christ finds meaning and expression with each new day and whatever God, in His wisdom, attaches to it. When Luther would wash his face in the morning, remembering his baptism, I have to believe he would, as he toweled off the soap and water, say to his reflection: "Your sins are forgiven in Christ! Praise God! Let's see how this day plays out in service to God and love of neighbor!"

It is critical to avail ourselves as much as we can of the gifts of God while at the same time believing that any and all moments dedicated to God matter deeply. I hope you'll join us each Wednesday evening for worship and a light dinner beforehand. Wherever two or three are gathered in the Lord's name, He is present and, regardless of scale, He is working.





For many years, the late CTK member Jack Kerr was a strong supporter of Calvary Rescue Mission, a safe place for homeless men in downtown Memphis. Now located in a new facility at 960 South Third Street, CRM was founded in 1967 by Milton and Betty Hatcher of Memphis. CRM is an emphatically Christian mission that requires each resident to attend an evening chapel held seven nights a week. Since a resident must pay \$5 per night to stay there, many of the men have jobs. Support from churches comes in the form of food, services, and funds.

Several years ago, CTK Men's Ministry adopted CRM in Jack Kerr's memory as its community outreach support. Each month a crew of CTK members prepares a Sunday night dinner for the residents, numbering in the 20s, plus staff. We keep the menu simple, but we cook with the love of Christ. Salisbury steak, mashed potatoes, mac and cheese, a green vegetable, tea, and dessert make up our menu. Men's Ministry receives funding for these meals from Thrivent and gets the cooking and serving support of faithful CTK members.
