<u>Altar Guild</u>

The Altar Guild is a group of women who prepare the sanctuary for worship with particular attention given to the proper presentation of the Sacraments. This includes setting up for Holy Communion and cleaning and storing Communion ware after the services. We also prepare for Baptisms, making sure all necessary items are in place. The altar paraments are changed to correlate with the liturgical season. We see that the pastor, acolyte, crucifer, and elder robes are clean and pressed, and that there are flowers for the services. We also have the privilege of decorating the sanctuary in observance of Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter. New members are always welcome and teamed up with a veteran member. Training is provided. Our meetings are held the 1st Tuesday of the month, September through May.

<u> Missions: Tanzania</u>

You have heard the stories about the baptism of hundreds in Tanzania and how the Lord is working in the lives of the people. We would like to present you with the opportunity to witness His work, first hand! Our outreach-centered bi-annual mission trip focuses on outreach to the Sukuma tribe located in a group of villages in the South East of Lake Victoria District (SELVD). Sukuma, Tanzania's largest tribe, is comprised of 8 million people. Only 20% of them are either Christian or Muslim; the others believe in superstitions, magic, ancestor worship, and traditional religions. Most are farmers, merchants, builders, and traditional doctors living in the countryside. This is where the SELVD and East of Lake Victoria (ELVD) dioceses of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT) work, currently in collaboration with the Mid-South District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, sharing the Gospel with 8 million Sukuma.
