Most of the work is done on Saturday, preparing for Sunday communion, or on Sunday cleaning up after the 8:30am service and replenishing for the 11:00am service. For Baptisms, the necessary items are put in place. The altar paraments are changed to correlate with the liturgical season. Other duties include seeing that the pastor, acolyte, crucifer, and elder robes are clean and pressed, that there are flowers for the services, and decorating the sanctuary in observance of Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter. New members are always welcome and teamed up with a veteran member. Altar Guild meetings are held the 1st Thursday of the month, September through May.

Conducted at Christ the King twice a year, this 13-14 week program meets weekly for about two hours and features biblical teaching on grief and recovery topics. It uses God's Word as its foundation with the knowledge that Jesus Christ is the only lasting source of comfort. Each GriefShare session includes a video seminar and group discussion. A GriefShare workbook assists in note-taking, journaling, and grief study. The videos feature top experts on grief recovery, dramatic reenactments about living with grief, and real-life stories of people who have experienced grief. During the small group discussion time, attendees have the opportunity to interact with others who have experienced a recent loss, learned from their experiences, and are ready to share. This is a friendly, caring group of people who will walk alongside one another through one of life's most difficult experiences. No one should have to grieve alone.

Missions: Tanzania

You have heard the stories about the baptism of hundreds in Tanzania and how the Lord is working in the lives of the people. We would like to present you with the opportunity to witness His work, first hand! Our outreach-centered bi-annual mission trip focuses on outreach to the Sukuma tribe located in a group of villages in the South East of Lake Victoria District (SELVD). Sukuma, Tanzania's largest tribe, is comprised of 8 million people. Only 20% of them are either Christian or Muslim; the others believe in superstitions, magic, ancestor worship, and traditional religions. Most are farmers, merchants, builders, and traditional doctors living in the countryside. This is where the SELVD and East of Lake Victoria (ELVD) dioceses of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT) work, currently in collaboration with the Mid-South District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, sharing the Gospel with 8 million Sukuma.
